


Linux Operating System

To execute X-Window, you need to make the X86Config file, which is a type of system setting file.

- 1. Press Enter at the first and the second screen after executing the X86Config file.
- 2. The third screen is for setting your mouse.
- 3. Set a mouse for your computer.
- 4. The next screen is for **selecting a keyboard**.
- 5. Set a Keyboard for your computer.
- 6. The next screen is for setting your monitor.
- 7. First of all, set a **horizontal frequency** for your monitor. (You can enter the frequency directly.)
- 8. Set a vertical frequency for your monitor. (You can enter the frequency directly.)
- 9. Enter the **model name of your monitor**. This information will not affect the actual execution of X-Window.
- You have finished setting up your monitor. Execute X-Window after setting other requested hardware.

Attaching the Base

- 1. Place the monitor upside-down on a flat work surface.
- 2. Align the tabs on the base with the corresponding slots on the bottom of the monitor.
- 3. Press the base onto the monitor until the tabs are fully engaged in the slots.
- 4. Push the base toward the front of the monitor until the release latch clicks into the locked

position. * Do not bend the snap.

Removing the Base

The user may easily select one of four pre-configured brightness and resolution options by simply pressing one of the MagicBright control buttons located on the monitor's front.

Push the MagicBright button. Push the MagicBright button again and select the desired mode. When Text is selected, the monitor turns on normal brightness identical to that of existing monitors, which is suitable for reading or working with text. When Internet is selected, the monitor turns on an enhanced brightness for Internet browsing (text and graphics), while retaining the readability of text characters. Switch to game mode and the screen brightness is automatically adjusted to be suitable for a game-playing environment full of graphic-rich, fast-changing scenes. When Entertain is selected, the monitor switches to maximum brightness (500 cd/m2), identical to television brightness, which is optimum for viewing entertainment programs (animation, DVDs, television or online games).

3) Select Disable Auto Detect from the menu when you wish to deactivate the Automatic Detect feature. Since this disables the Auto Detect capability of the monitor, the monitor does not automatically create a Highlight Zone.

(When you first install the program, Automatic Detect is the default.)

2. Manual detect

In Manual Detect mode, you can either select a window or use the Drag function to create a Highlight Zone.

1 Selecting a window:

Click the Highlight icon()on the Windows taskbar once to activate() the cursor. Move the cursor onto the window of your choice and click once to Highlight the window. Drag: Click the Highlight icon())on the Windows taskbar once to activate().

2 Drag

4. Other Features

The Highlight Zone function remembers the variables of the selected areas in Automatic and Manual Detect modes, respectively.

- 1 If the window selected as a Highlight Zone is moved or its size changed, the Highlight Zone changes accordingly.
- 2 If an un-selected window overlaps the window selected as a Highlight Zone, the Highlight Zone of the selected window turns off.

However, it does not turn off the Zone completely and only makes the window shift to standby mode while the settings are saved. When the window is re-activated, the Highlight Zone turns on again with the settings unchanged.

- When the Highlight Zone is created using the Drag function, the Zone functions independently of the above since it uses a random portion of the screen instead of a particular window.
- Note 1: How to cancel the saved variables of a selected window.
 - 1) When a window selected in Automatic Detect mode is replaced with another window also selected in Automatic Detect mode, only the last selection is saved, and the Highlight Zone function is deactivated for the previous windows.



1. Brightness







Rotation



2. Fine Tuning : When the mouse pointer is correctly placed over the Trapezoid icon, the icon color changes. Then, click the left mouse button and the Trapezoid fine tuning sub-menu appears in the left bottom corner of the screen. Then, click the left mouse button to achieve the desired Trapezoid fine tuning.

Parallel

This adjusts the parallelogram level of the screen.

1. Selection and Adjustment : Place and click the mouse pointer on the Parallelogram icon and then drag as desired. The Parallelogram icon is located in the screen corners. If the mouse is dragged to the left, the image area tilts to the right. If the mouse is dragged to the right, the image area tilts to the left.

MagicBright refers to a new monitor feature that offers screen display quality twice as bright and clear than that of existing monitors. It provides display brightness and resolution most appropriate for viewing text, Internet or multimedia animations to satisfy varying user requirements. The location and the position of the monitor may influence the quality and other features of the monitor.

1. If there are any woofer speakers near the monitor, unplug and relocate the woofer to another room.

- 2. Remove all electronic devices such as radios, fans, clocks and telephones that are within 3 feet (one meter) of the monitor.
- 3. Run the despeckling function again after moving your device.



Useful Tips

- A monitor recreates visual signals received from the PC. Therefore, if there is trouble with the
